What is the SISC Oncology Center of Excellence (COE) Program?

Self-Insured Schools of California (SISC) has partnered with Contigo Health to offer their Oncology Center of Excellence Program to help covered members and their loved ones navigate their cancer diagnosis and treatment journey.

The Oncology Center of Excellence Program is a specialized voluntary health care program that enables members to obtain expert care and support from one of the designated Centers of Excellence. City of Hope in Duarte, CA is the currently designated Oncology Center of Excellence. This world-renowned oncology treatment and research hospital is among the best throughout the United States who can provide specialized clinical support to the member's local oncologist.

Who Can Participate with the COE Program?

Employees and covered dependents enrolled in an Anthem or Blue Shield PPO medical plan excluding those enrolled in a SISC 65+ PPO plan.

Contigo Health verifies eligibility with the medical plan prior to referral to City of Hope.

Participation is voluntary for eligible members. Members who are diagnosed with cancer are not required to travel to City of Hope for an evaluation.

What's Covered Under the COE Program?

Program elements include:

- An expert in-person evaluation at a recognized Center of Excellence, by a multidisciplinary cancer-focused clinical team led by an oncology expert specializing in the patient's particular type of cancer.
- Treatment options that may not be available in the member's local community.
- Ongoing collaboration between City of Hope oncology team and member's local care team.
- Navigation and advocacy support provided by the Contigo Health nurse team every step of the way.
- 12 month follow up, to assist the patient with decision support or other resources available in the member's local community.

Cost Considerations

How much will the program cost?

If you are enrolled in a SISC PPO Plan, program services are paid at 100% and your deductible does not apply. If you are enrolled in an HSA plan, your program services are covered at 100% after meeting your deductible per IRS guidelines.

If I travel to an Oncology Center of Excellence, will my travel expenses be covered?

Transportation, lodging, and a daily stipend for meals/expenses for you and a companion will be covered and coordinated through Contigo Health. Per IRS guidelines, a portion of the travel expenses covered may be treated as taxable income. Please check with your tax accountant about this topic.

Oncology Program Details

Will I have access to clinical trials?

Yes. All patients will be evaluated for clinical trials for which they may be suitable candidates. City of Hope is an industry leader in cancer research and treatment and are separately conducting over 500 clinical trials and enrolling more than 10,000 patients' total.

Does everyone with a cancer diagnosis need to use the Oncology Care Program?

No, this program is optional and is not required. The Oncology Center of Excellence program was created to help with navigating a diagnosis and treatment, but you are not required to use the program. This program is available for eligible members who are looking for a program that provides assistance with navigating the process.

Why Use The Oncology COE Program?

The SISC Oncology program was developed to meet the unique needs of cancer patients

- Helps reduce the confusion around the "cancer lingo" by providing one on one support
- Assigns patients a clinical advocate who can take the time to provide additional support in understanding medical literature or educational resources about their disease
- Provides a patient focused concierge service customized to fit their needs

If a member is diagnosed with cancer and suddenly feels like they've moved to a completely foreign country and aren't certain of the right questions to ask, the SISC Oncology COE program is for them!

What to Expect from Beginning to End of COE Program

Contigo Health Member Advocate

- Begins intake (collects demographic information)
- Verifies eligibility

Contigo Health Cancer Patient Advocate Nurse

- Completed Intake
- Gathers basic medical history
- Transfer case to City of Hope clinical team
- Completes Needs Assessment; provides direction and support to other SISC programs & community resources, health carrier navigation

City of Hope Nurse Case Manager

- Collects medical records from local providers
 Cohood also Virtual
- Schedules Virtual Introduction
- Schedules In-Person (or Virtual) Evaluation and supportive consults

Contigo Health Travel Administration & Evaluation Visit

- CH coordinates travel and authorizes stipends
- City of Hope oncology team conducts in-person or virtual evaluation with supportive consults same or next day. Additional labs and/or testing may be conducted to allow City of Hope team to provide complete evaluation.

12 Months Post Evaluation

- Contigo Health and City of Hope work together to provide ongoing decision support.
- City of Hope clinical team can review updated testing and provide recommendations as needed
